1. Title of the Practice:

Student involvement in Extension and Outreach community service activities through NSS in nearby adopted villages

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- To develop leadership and community development attitude among the students.
- To generate awareness into society towards Environment, Health and ethical responsibilities among the villagers
- > To develop interactive network with the community to serve the nation
- > To sensitize students for paying back to society
- By adopting a village and to maintain consistency in conducting various social activities
- > To develop organizational and communication skills among students

3. The Context

The institute conducts its NSS activities throughout the academic session as a team work of NSS volunteers under the active guidance and leadership of program officer. Giving back to the community creates in the student the values of holistic development, exponential learning and national reconstruction. The Extension activities of the College inculcates the spirit of voluntary work among students through sustained community interaction. It brings our academic institutions closer to the society. It is a link between the campus and the community, college and village, knowledge and action. The ultimate objective is to channelize youth energy for the national reconstruction. The NSS unit commit the student youth to work practically and enthusiastically in the adopted villages by involving them as NSS volunteers with the purpose of inculcating awareness in rural community regarding education, prevention of disease. The NSS volunteers work with the rural community. Moreover, a wide range of activities like Cleanliness, Personal Health, Plantation, Voter Awareness Program, Practice of "Yoga", Observance of important days and Awareness Campaign are organized during special camps in the nearby villages. The college through these extension provides the students a platform to get involved with real life activities and the thereby become responsible citizens of India.

4. The Practice

The college annually organizes number of extension and outreach activities with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community services. Activities like NSS special camp, awareness rallies, cleanliness drive, blood donation camp, health checkup camp, plantation in the college and at the NSS special camp site are organized by the college. Health checkup camp and Yoga training is conducted in NSS camp for the students and villagers.

- N.S.S. volunteers donate their labour for village cleanliness and institutional premises. They generate awareness regarding cleanliness among villagers through collaborative work. Students participate in Swachh Bharat Campaign, Tree Plantation Program, Sanitization, Say No to Plastic, etc. programs in the nearby adopted villages.
- Blood donation camps and Health check-up camps are arranged under the aegis of Model Blood Bank, SVRR Government General Hospital, Tirupati, Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (SVIMS), Tirupathi, Primary health Care center, Mangalam, Vasan Eye Care Hospital, Tirupathi, Sankalpa Super Specialty Hospital, Tirupathi, Kamakshi Dental Hospital, Tirupathi, Vennela Eye Care Center, Tirupathi, Govt. Hospital, Chittoor, Micro Labs, Tirupathi, Krishna Dental Hospital, Tirupathi and SVR Dental Clinic, Tirupathi.
- For Women Empowerment and Protection an awareness program on Disha APP, Beti Bachao, Beti Padaho etc. programs were arranged.
- The College has adopted 5 villages in the vicinity as part of the Central Government UBA Programme to render their social services to the community.
- The College works with the people of the said villages to identify developmental challenges and evolve appropriate solutions to accelerate sustainable growth
- The College conducted an economic survey of 5 Panchayat/ villages viz, Perumalla Palli, Mare Palli, Mambedu, Kurivi Kuppam and Veduru Kuppam.

5. Evidence of Success

Through these activities, students are motivated and get an opportunity to do social work and develop sense of nationality and has imparted values such as charity, selflessness and discipline. Special camps and rallies on social issues expose the students to the need of the community and various activities involve them in the problem solving process. Medical health checkup and blood donation camp create among the volunteers a sense of social responsibility, residential camps build a competency for group living and community sharing. The volunteers involve in different activities also acquire leadership qualities leading to national and social harmony. There was A change in villager's attitude towards cleanliness was clearly evident, Calls and invitations were received from the villagers to the college to organize more training and guidance sessions on Yoga and Medical Camp, the organizational skill among the students appeared to be enhanced while organizing various programmes in the college. These events helped the college, staff and students connect with the rural people and helped in creating a good rapport between the people and the college.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Though N.S.S. volunteers are committed to work for the cause of community and society, yet it is very difficult for them to live up to the high expectations of the people. They have to perform numerous tasks in a relatively short period of time, while completing their degree courses. They are bounded by rules and regulations. Participation of the villagers was comparatively less during day time owing to their engagement in agricultural activities.

They come across some practical problems while performing various awareness campaigns. One such common problem is that some villagers are reluctant to cooperate with the volunteers and adamant about their notions. Organizers too, come across various problems. Selecting a proper place for the camp is a tough task. However, problems are overcome and activities go forward in the direction of success. Sufficient funds should be allocated for NSS activities.

1. Title of the Practice:

Student Centric Effective Teaching-Learning Process

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- > To create a student-centric learning environment
- Changing the traditional mode of teaching learning to innovative methods
- Making effective use of ICT
- Increasing the student's participation
- Creating awareness about the ICT tools

3. The Context

The problems like COVID -19 pandemic created lot of challenges in front of educational institutes. The teaching learning process became tough and challenging these days. For a past few decades it has been globally realized and accepted that the teaching learning approach has to be student centric for its best outcomes. A student centric teaching learning approach is one that keeps student in centre employing learning strategies focusing on students. As the institution believes that the student is the direct object and first beneficiary of education process it believes in employing a student centric teaching learning approach. Which include identifying the types of learners and dealing with them accordingly, modifying the existing modes of teaching by making them more flexible, rich in variety, interactive, experiential, practical and inclusive of technology; making relevant changes in schemes and methods of evaluation and assessment wherever possible and encouraging and motivating them for better performance. Also through Student centric approach the students and teachers communicate, organize, manage assignments and moreover will go paperless. It also aims to simplify creating, distributing, grading assignments and engaging students in learning online or remotely.

4. The Practice

Information & Communications Technology (ICT) enabled teaching methodologies are being followed by the faculty members in class rooms as a

complementary tool for conventional teaching methods. The use of multimedia teaching aids like, LCD projectors and internet enabled computer systems are usually employed in class room.

Different Stages are adopted in using ICT Methodology which are enlisted below:

Proper information about the course undertaken: Students are informed in the beginning of the session about their programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes in different ways such as college website, departmental notice boards and classroom interactions. And also through Canvas tool.

Identification of Slow and Advanced learners: Students are identified as slow and advanced learners and strategies are adopted accordingly. These learner types are identified through personal interaction and mentor mentee interactions and class tests. Tutorials and extra classes are held for the slow learners to bring them at par with other students, whereas advanced learners are assigned tasks such as project works, field work, assignments, presentations and seminars to promote them. Moderate types of learners are encouraged to improve their skills and fall in the category of advanced learners.

Incorporation of ICT in teaching learning: In order to make teaching learning more interesting and interactive, emphasis is given on involving ICT in teaching learning. Through Canvas tool students are provided e learning resources in the form of e-notes, e-assignments and presentations. Students are informed about various web resources they can consult for better learning.

5. Evidence of Success

Canvas tool has become a best practice in the delivery of academic classes during the lockdown time. It also made communication between teachers and students much easier in terms of assignments, quizzes, and tests. As a result of this strategy students were able to progress their courses without delay. This practice has resulted in a marked increase in the pass percentage of students, who interact and actively take part in the lecture session.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- Adapting to the new method of teaching and creation of digital content was the challenging task for the faculty members which they have completed successfully.
- Student participation at the beginning of the course is less and at last after mentoring students have turned up.



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
